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Meeting Minutes May 6, 2021

1. CALL TO ORDER – 7:01 pm

2. ROLL CALL

Present: Commissioners Berry, Crawford, Baron, Somerton, Alter, Wise, Buchwald, Gómez, Michelsen

- 3. **GUEST INTRODUCTIONS:** Erin Seghesio, Mandy Ingham and Bill Stevens, NOAA Fisheries; Sean Cochran and Steve Schindler, CDFW
- 4. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** Commissioner Somerton made a motion to approve the minutes; Commissioner Alter seconded the motion. All aye, the minutes were approved; Commissioner Crawford and Buchwald abstained since they were not present at the last meeting.
- 5. **PUBLIC COMMENTS**. None.
- 6. Update on Status of Fishing Regulations and Potential Changes for Santa Cruz County. Sean Cochran, CDFW, explained that the regulations for Inland Fisheries have been substantially updated, but that these changes do not affect Santa Cruz County. There has been a 5-year process to simplify and align fishing for non-anadromous fishing throughout the state, including trout fishing. For anadromous fisheries, including Santa Cruz County, there will be a separate process to simplify and align regulations, which will most likely result in a new fishing season of Jan.1-March 31 open all days of the week. There will be a public process for these regulation updates and Sean will provide information to the commission on when this is expected to happen and during the process. Bill Stevens, NOAA Fisheries, advocated for the implementation of low-flow fishing closures for Santa Cruz County. Sean will find out about the current status of these efforts and report back to the commission. Commissioner Wise asked about allowing only artificial lures with barbless hooks for San Lorenzo; Sean responded that this could be part of regulation changes.
- 7. **Coho Salmon- Species in the Spotlight.** Erin Seghesio, NOAA Fisheries, gave a presentation about coho salmon and recovery efforts, and along with Mandy Ingham and Bill Stevens, responded to questions. Snorkeling and spawning monitoring efforts were recently unfunded; Commissioner Alter asked about partnering with CSUMB; NOAA has been partnering with UCSC, but worth exploring this option. A very high priority is to develop a new conservation hatchery for coho salmon for the Santa Cruz Mountains Diversity Stratum. NOAA Fisheries estimated that it will cost \$300,000 for a feasibility study and an estimated \$25 million for the facility with annual operating costs of \$1-2 million. The existing conservation hatchery facility at Kingfisher Flat should be up and running by September.
- 8. **Discuss 2021 Work Plan; Questions for Regional Conservation Investment Strategy and June Agenda.** Work Plan discussion included value of the time spent on discussing the work plan and how the work plan can help direct efforts and motivate commissioner involvement. As a new commissioner, Commissioner Crawford reported that the Work Plan helped communicate issues that the commission is working on. General agreement to reduce future time spent on the Work Plan for 2021. Staff had provided Work Plan updated from March meeting to include impacts from homeless encampments on riparian areas. RCIS will be focus of June meeting; Chair Berry asked how recent Rail Trail decisions

could affect RCIS. Commissioner Baron asked Staff to communicate with Planning Dept on timeline for updating natural resource ordinances, to report back in June.

- 9. Elect Chair and Vice Chair to start July 1, 2021. Commissioner Somerton made a motion to nominate Chris Berry for Chair; Commissioner Baron seconded the motion. With a roll call vote, all aye; the motion passed. Commission Gomez made a motion to nominate David Somerton as Vice Chair; Commissioner Wise seconded the motion. With a roll call vote, all aye; the motion passed.
- 10. **Commissioner Reports and Announcements.** Captain Schindler reported that the State Fish and Game Commission approved statewide changes to the steelhead and coho salmon fishing regulations. CDFW will provide more information at the May meeting. Captain Schindler also reported that we have just one warden locally. Commissioner Buchwald provided information on striped bass in Pajaro River.
- 11. Adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 9:03 pm.

<u>Learn</u> about current status and research; impacts of CZU fire. <u>Monitor</u> low-flow fishing closure status and fishing regulation changes. <u>Monitor</u> progress for new coho salmon conservation hatchery. <u>Action</u> – communicate with CDFW about fishing regulations.

Public Grants Program

<u>Monitor</u> - Fish and Game Propagation Fund balance <u>Action</u> – Decide on fund amount to proceed with Public Grants program in 2021 (Sept)

CZU Fire Recovery

<u>Learn</u> about fire recovery status and actions. <u>Monitor</u> PG & E's Community Wildfire Safety Program <u>Action</u> – consider action to comment on post-fire recovery issues.

Riparian Corridor Protection and Enhancement

<u>Monitor</u> progress on County efforts to develop a Riparian Enhancement Program <u>Monitor</u> how local agencies are dealing with homeless living in riparian areas.

Action – support riparian corridor enhancement when appropriate

<u>Action</u> – communicate importance of protecting riparian from homeless encampments for wildlife and water quality benefits.

Monarch butterfly conservation
