


# GIS Database Update

- Amount: \$5,000
- Funding Application:
  - Identification and mapping of all parcels that are served by a private well
- Source: SWRCB SAFER program



# Small Water System Outreach

- Amount:
  - \$10,000 staff time
  - \$1,000 outreach materials
- Funding Application:
  - Utilizing the GIS information in the previous slide, send mailers to all private well owners to notify them of resources that are available to them
- Source: SWRCB SAFER program




## Task 3: Drought Resources Portal

- Amount: \$5,000
- Funding Application:
  - Hiring of a web designer to create Drought Resources Web portal. The mailers would direct private well owners to this portal, which would provide a list of resources, including the following resources

## Task 6: Private Well Inspections

- Amount: \$30,000
- Funding Application: Assist private well owners to determine the health of their water source, including
  - Well soundings
  - Water Quality Testing
    - County also received funding to increase the number of tests it can perform on drinking water


## Task 7: Point Of Use/ Point Of Entry Treatment Systems

- Amount: \$250,000
  - *Only the cost of the units are included*
- Funding Application:
  - Cover the cost of installing POU/POE treatment systems for both individual and shared water systems with water quality issues.
  - Recipients must confirm they are income limited to receive funding
  - Source: SWRCB SAFER program




## Task 4: Dry Well Reporting Tool

- Amount: \$5,000
- Possible Funding Application:
  - Hiring of a web designer to create a Dry Well Reporting Tool. Private Well owners would be able to use this portal to report their well going dry and request additional resources to assist them.

## Task 5: Hauled Water

- Amount: Total of \$160,000
  - SWRCB SAFER program: \$80,000
  - DWR: \$80,000
- Possible Funding Application:
  - Contract directly with one or more private water haulers to provide a predetermined amount of water to well owners that have reported dry wells
  - SAFER funding can only be provided to income limited individuals and will only provide 50 gallons per person per day



## Task 6: Resiliency Feasibility Studies

- Amount: \$50,000
- Possible Fund Applications:
  - Additional planning assistance for dry well owners to identify long term solutions, like new tanks, wells, or connections with nearby systems
